Against Connecticut on August 1 Canty recorded her 300th career steal to become one of 11 players in WNBA history to reach 800 career rebounds, 800 career assists and 300 career steals ... On August 15 Canty recorded a season-high eight assists in the same game. **2008:** Canty completed her 10th year in the WNBA starting in 28 games, averaging 8.1 points, 2.5 rebounds with 4.1 assists per game...
